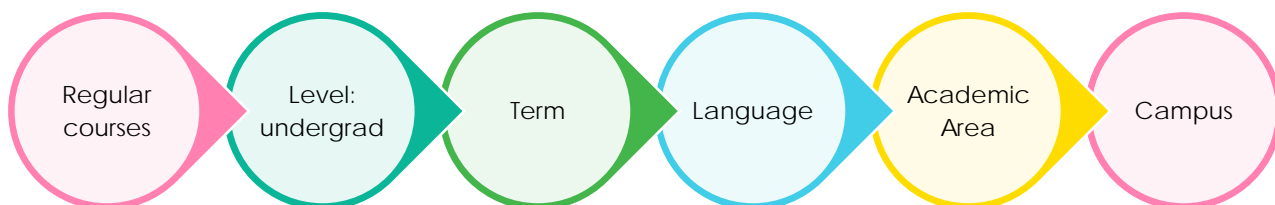

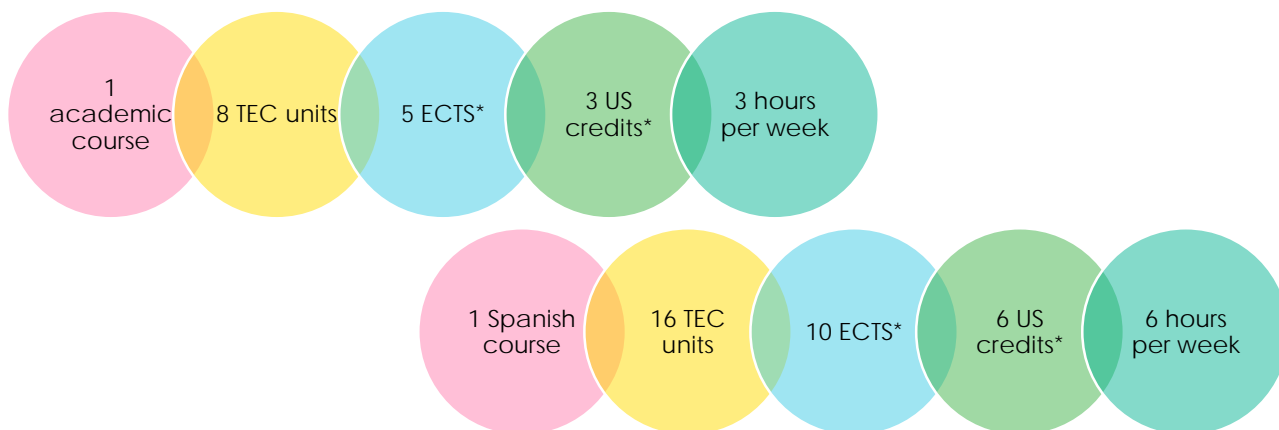

Credits and work load

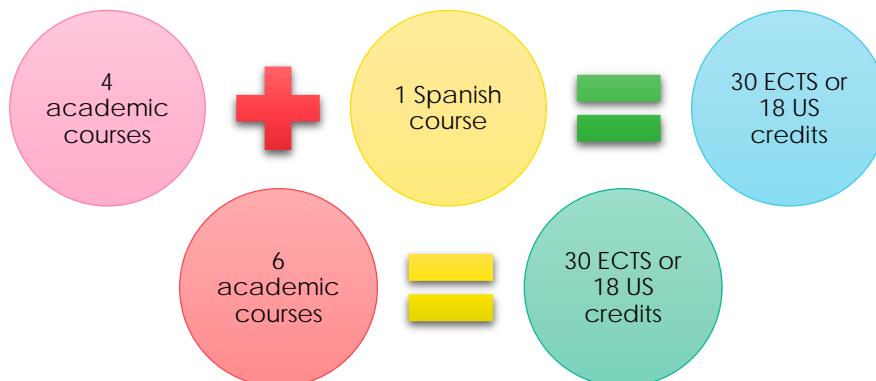
Crediting system

The amount of credits given by a course is defined by the amount of hours a student has to spend in it weekly. Most academic courses are with 8 units. However, our Spanish courses are intensive and take twice as much dedication.



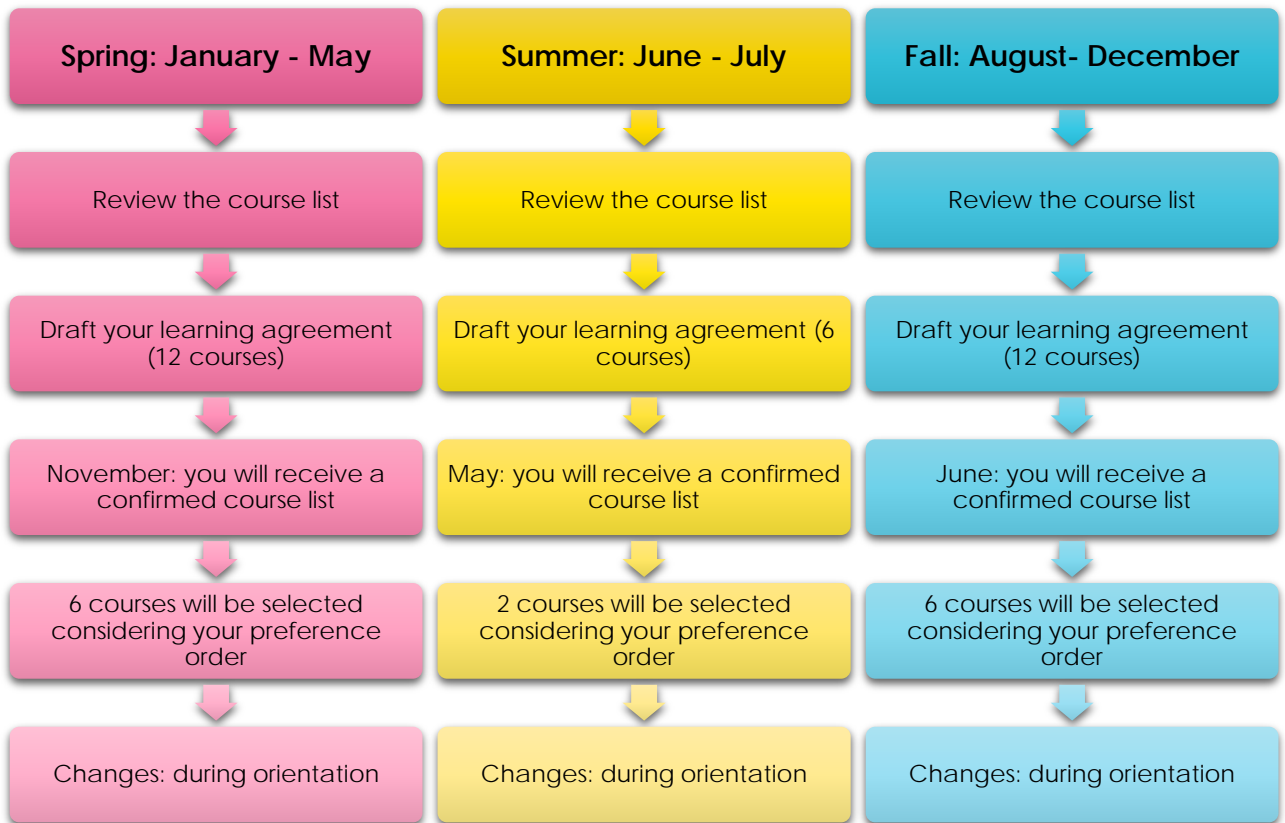
Work load

Students can enroll in up to 48 Tec units (30 ECTS or 18 USA credits) per semester in whatever combination they might like. If a student needs more credits, it will be reviewed in a case by case basis with a maximum of 56 units per semester.

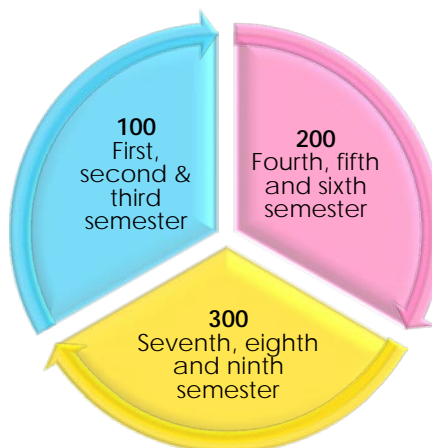

Language requirements

COURSES TAUGHT IN ENGLISH

All our students are allowed to take courses in English. The home university is responsible of verifying the level of English of the student that are sent to our institution. It is recommended to have a score of at least 550 points in institutional TOEFL, even though it is not required to send the score.

COURSES TAUGHT IN SPANISH

If the student wants to select courses taught in Spanish, a B2 proof of proficiency is required. If the student does not have a proof of proficiency, they can take the online placement test and interview to validate their Spanish level.

SPANISH LANGUAGE COURSES

Student wishing to take Spanish as a second language must take the online placement test and interview to determine the Spanish level. All students are allowed to take one Spanish language course.

Important Considerations

Students are responsible of reviewing with the home university:

1. The compulsory number of courses or credits that they should take at Tec for accrediting a full load at the home university at the end of the exchange
2. Receiving approbation regarding the contents and levels of the selected courses
3. We encourage students to receive approval of at least 12 courses to have options in case some courses close or overlap. This is a safety measure as some universities/coordinators are on vacations during the orientation week
4. Keep in mind the previous approval of 12 courses is required as some Universities are on vacation during our orientation week, which is the only time to make changes.
