AZERBAIJAN

SHORT STORY

Azerbaijan is miraculous country with its abundant natural resources, centuries-old culture, history and ancient people, whose lifestyle presents a unique and harmonious combination of the traditions and ceremonies of different cultures and civilizations. Azerbaijan is one of the ancient sites of humankind. Its territory is rich with archeological monuments, which prove it to be one of the regions of first settlement. The first states or ethic-political unions in Azerbaijan appeared around Lake Urmiya at the end of 4th and at the beginning of 3rd millennium BC. States such as Manna, the kingdom of Iskit (Skit, Skif), Atropatena and Albania appear here in the first millennium BC. This fertile, generous and friendly land was the home for many thinkers, philosophers, scientists, poets, architects, musicians and artists. When Islam spread in Azerbaijan in the middle of seventh century, the country became one of the centers of Islamic civilization. Azerbaijan enriched Islamic and world civilizations with such geniuses as poet Nizami Ganjavi; philosopher Bahmaniyar; astronomer Nasreddin Tusi and many others. The late 15th and early of 16th centuries were very crucial for Azerbaijan when the prominent statesman Shah Ismail Khatai united all the territories of Azerbaijan under his control. In the late 18th and early of 19th century the war between Iran and Russia led to division of Azerbaijan between these two empires.

Following the collapse of the Russian empire, the Azerbaijan Democratic Republic (ADR) was established on May 28, 1918. The ADR was the first Parliamentary Republic in the history of the people of Azerbaijan, and the first democratic, legal and secular state in the Islamic world. Azerbaijan was the first among Muslim states and some European countries to grant women equal political rights with men. The ADR succumbed to the military attack of Soviet Russia in April of 1920. After over 70 years of Soviet occupation Azerbaijan's independence was restored in 1991 with the adoption of the State Independence resolution. With the collapse of the Soviet Union in late 1991, Armenian armed forces began military actions against Azerbaijan with the purpose of occupying Nagorno-Karabakh (the Mountainous Karabakh). By early 1994, some 20% of Azerbaijani territory including Karabakh was occupied by Armenian military forces.

BAKU







There are a number of interesting historical sites in Baku you may want to visit during your study in Azerbaijan.

Among the historical monuments of Baku the most exciting one is the Old City - Icheri Sheher, surrounded by large fortress walls on three sides. It hosts the palace of the Shirvanshahs with a complex of various structures: a burial vault, palace, a mosque, Divan-khane, the Mausoleum of Seyd Yakhya Bakuvi (mausoleum of a dervish) - a court scientist. The palace was built by Shirvanshah Khalilullah I (1417-1462) and his son Farrukh Yasar (1462-1501). An interesting monument of antiquity is the Juma Mosque with the inscription of Sultan Oldzhaytu (13th century).

ADA University

ADA University was established under the decree dated January 13th, 2014, by the President of the Republic of Azerbaijan. The University is a state higher education institution engaged in the delivery of undergraduate and graduate degree programs in addition to the advancement of research.



The University is the legal heir of the

Azerbaijan Diplomatic Academy (ADA) and Information Technologies University. They were merged in January 2014 to establish ADA University.

Founded on March 6, 2006, the Azerbaijan Diplomatic Academy began offering an Advanced Foreign Service Program to diplomats of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and civil servants in the government, as of January 2007. The Academy launched its first master's degree in September 2009, followed by bachelor's degrees in September 2011.



TRANSPORTATION

It gets overcrowded during the rush hours and using the subway is the most effective way to arrive everywhere on time. The travel cards can be purchased from all Underground Stations for 2 AZN per card. They are permanent and can be charged with any number of trips (30 qapik) (coins) per trip and recharged at any time.



Buses go everywhere in the city and the one ride costs 30 qapik (coins) per trip (AZN 1=100 qapik (coins)). Destinations are usually posted on the front and the right side of the bus, or on the information screens of bus stations. There are no travel cards for buses, so you need to pay cash for each trip. Buses can also take you to the regions (appr. AZN 8-12 depending on the distance), from the Bus Terminal in Bilajari.

Taxis can be ordered from several taxi services, or just flagged down on the street. There is no strictly regulated pricing system, but the approximate cost is some AZN 6 for any trip within the Centre of Baku. There are no meters in most of taxis, and it is recommended to negotiate the cost in advance. Only new taxis have meters (London Cabs). Prices for the planned directions could be also checked from the taxi services before their taxi.

CURRENCY & PHONE SERVICES

The Azerbaijan currency is the MANAT (AZN) with the following exchange rates as of 30 August 2019.

Telephone Services

The country code for Azerbaijan is **+994.** The area code for Baku is **12**. Calls made within this area code are free of charge. Furthermore, telephone booths (public pay phones) are available for local calls all around the city, especially near the underground stations. To use them, you should purchase a card from the Telephone Exchange or from nearby shops and kiosks. Cellular phones may be purchased and used locally. There are three mobile phone operators currently in Azerbaijan: Azercell (050 & 051), Bakcell (055) and Nar Mobile (070). GSM coverage includes the entire area of Azerbaijan. Due to high roaming charges, the best option for foreign visitors is to buy a SIM-card from one of the cellular phone operators. SIM-card normally also includes a local phone number. When purchasing a SIM-card, you will be required to show your ID since all the mobile numbers have to be registered. Top-up vouchers are also easily available.

Incoming calls are free of charge.

To call a landline from a cellular phone, dial first '012' and proceed with a phone number. The call is payable.

To call cellular numbers:

- Azercell: 050; 051 + seven digit number;

Bakcell: 055 + seven digit number;

- Nar Mobile: 070 + seven digit number.

To call a mobile phone from landline is payable.

Food/Shopping

 Products can be purchased from supermarkets but buying them in bazaars/open markets will be cheaper.



- Prices for household good are different in different markets.
- The water is usually safe in Baku and in the major towns, but it is not recommended to drink water from the tap.

• There are various places that sell clothing, but the brand shops are mainly concentrated in the malls or in downtown shops. You can purchase cheaper cloths in

the bazaars or the shopping centers in the areas that are located further from the downtown.



HEALTH CARE

- Both public and private medical facilities exist in health system of Azerbaijan. Public polyclinics offer outpatient services, while hospitals and specialized clinics offer both outpatient and inpatient services.
- Professional primary and secondary health care is available throughout Azerbaijan at private clinics and hospitals, which have modern equipment.
- Private health insurance is voluntary in Azerbaijan. Insurance companies offer health insurance packages for the companies and individuals. They offer different packages, including emergency medical insurance. A health insurance package is usually valid for one year and covers both outpatient and inpatient services.
- ADA Health Center provides medical service at ADA University. The
 center provides the medical services for students, faculty and staff
 and it is mainly designed to provide first aid services in case of
 illness and injuries including medications, injections, blood pressure
 measuring, temperature measuring, electrocardiogram
 etc.

Visa, Registration, Temporary Residence Permit

• Visa

Travel to Azerbaijan requires an entry visa, unless there is an agreement on visa free travel with the country of citizenship. Citizens of countries, which have visa-free regime agreement and citizens who have issued visa, only need to go through passport control once they arrive at one of the international airports of Azerbaijan.

ADA University urges its international students to apply for a e-visa. **Important note: as a purpose of the trip indicate** —<u>Education</u>.

International students can also apply for the visa at the closest Azerbaijani Embassy. Information about visa procedures for specific countries can be obtained from the respective embassies.

If there is no Embassy in student's home country or e-visa option, he or she will be able to receive a visa at visa division of the Consular Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) operated in Heydar Aliyev International Airport.

Students will most likely be issued a single-entry visa with the validity period of 30 days and be required to apply for a temporary residence permit once in Azerbaijan. The temporary residence Identity Card enables students to travel outside Azerbaijan and return without visa requirements through the period indicated on it.

• Registration

Within first 10 days of arriving in Azerbaijan all foreigners are required to register with the State Migration Services. If you fail to register on time, you will need to pay penalty up to 400 AZN.

• <u>Temporary Residency Permit</u>

Upon arrival in Azerbaijan, students will have the standard 30 days visa. Then, after submission of the required registration form, our international students will be assisted in the process of receiving temporary resident status from the State Migration Service.

For Temporary Resident Permit you will need to submit:

- Passport original
- 2. 3x4 photo with red background 2 pcs

Medical check-up results. The check-up includes HIV, Hepatitis B and C, Therapist and Neurologist conclusions from approved hospital in Baku only.

Expected Expenses during study at ADA University

These are estimated costs; the real expenses could be less or more.

Temporary resident permit fee	122 AZN (41 AZN -fee, 91 AZN- medicals) per year *Renewal of temporary resident permit costs the same amount and it is due to be renewed every year upon graduation

Housing	Up to 400 AZN depending on choice
Housing deposit	200 AZN
Nostrification of your diploma and transcripts to be done in Baku	Up to 200 AZN (depending on # of pages)
University Cap & Gown (for graduation ceremony)	30 AZN to rent
Translation/legalization/apostille of ADA University diploma to be done in Baku	Up to 70 AZN (mailing is not included, as the cost of mailing is separate, and it depends from the destination country)
Utilities (per apartment)	Estimated 50 AZN - depending on usage (monthly) Note: when bills are shared between roommates it is cheaper
Internet (per apartment)	20 AZN per month
Cable TV (per apartment)	10 AZN per month
Public Transportation & Taxi	Estimated 15-20 AZN and more per month (depending on usage and destinations)
Medical care*	Averages between 50-80 AZN for a one doctor consultation depending on clinics
Parking	750 AZN per year
Meals	Students are encouraged to cook at home as it will be cheaper. It is difficult to say how much food will cost. This will mostly depend on students' preferences.
