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## 1. COURSE OFFER – DEPENDING ON PROGRAM AND FIELD OF STUDY

### 1.1 Erasmus+ students and students from Swiss Universities:

- a. You can **only** enroll in Bachelor's Degree courses and groups from the same School or Centre where you have been admitted. Check in your Admission Letter the School in which you have been admitted to.
  - School of Law and Social Sciences (Getafe Campus).
  - School of Humanities, Communication and Library Science (Getafe Campus)
  - School of Engineering (Leganés Campus).
  - School of Law and Social Sciences. (Colmenarejo Campus, only allowed for the Bachelor's Degree in Tourism).
- b. You may also select any of our Humanities Courses (short courses about culture, history, politics...) that belong to your School. Most of them are taught in Spanish; you can enroll in a maximum of three Humanities courses.

Example: if your Letter of Admission states that you have been admitted in the School of Law and Social Sciences (Getafe Campus), your choices are:

- Bachelor's Degree Subjects from the School of Law and Social Sciences in Getafe. You cannot apply for courses taught at the School of Humanities or the School of Engineering, but you can enroll in subjects from another Bachelor's Degree as long as they belong to the School of Law and Social Sciences in Getafe.
- Humanities Courses.

## 2. BACHELOR'S DEGREES @ UC3M

As an exchange student you will be allowed to take courses from different Bachelor's degrees and different years (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, etc.) in English or Spanish.

**\*\*IMPORTANT:** Since UC3M regular students do not spend a semester on an exchange till they are studying their 3<sup>rd</sup> year, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year courses have very limited spots. As a result, it will be difficult to get a spot in these courses, especially if they have only one group.

## 3. COURSE RESTRICTIONS FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Please note that the following subjects are not available for exchange students:


- **"Skills: English", "Advanced knowledge of Spreadsheets" and "Soft skills"**
  - **"Professional Internships"**: Internships in companies or in a UC3M Department/Service might be recognized as curricular internships. Please bear in mind the following information:
    - **School of Humanities: Not available**
    - **School of Social Sciences and Law: Not available**
    - **School of Engineering**: The student should look for professional internships on her/his own and confirm it with UC3M. It is not allowed to include the internship in the Learning Agreement if it has not been approved by UC3M before.
  - **"Bachelor Thesis (Trabajo Fin de Grado)" under the following conditions:**
    - **School of Humanities: Not available**
    - **School of Social Sciences and Law (only in the second semester)**: you must specifically request it via email to [incoming@uc3m.es](mailto:incoming@uc3m.es)
    - **School of Engineering (first or second semester)**: you must specifically request it writing to [internationaleps@uc3m.es](mailto:internationaleps@uc3m.es)
- Enrollment in Bachelor Thesis will not be approved without the permission from the corresponding School.

- Subjects from the **Hispanic Studies Program**.
- Any subject from the **Masters-Postgraduate** Studies programs: Only available for students coming from universities with a proper agreement for Masters and Postgraduate studies.
- Subject **“Spanish Language”** from the **Bachelor’s Degree in Humanities Studies**: take into account that this is not a class for learning Spanish, but it requires a high command on Spanish (C1 level CEFR).
- **“Blended learning”** Subjects or “without teaching” subjects (i.e. “Skills: Second language”, Bachelor in International Studies).
- Subjects from the **Program in Philosophy, Politics and Economics**.
- Subjects from the **UC3M Open BA Program in Social Sciences and Humanities**
- Subjects from the **UC3M Open BS Program in Engineering** .
- Subjects from 1st and 2nd courses from the **Bachelor’s Degree in Library and Information**.
- Subjects from the **Bachelor’s Degree in Security Engineering** and the **Bachelor's Degree in Management of Public Security**.
- Subjects from the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the **Bachelor’s Degree in Data Science and Engineering**.
- Subject **“Information Skills”** 1,5 ects.
- Subjects from the **Bachelor’s Degrees in Engineering Physics** and in **Applied Mathematics and Computing**.
- **“New” Bachelor’s Degrees**: New Bachelor’s Degrees pending of verification by Madri+d Foundation are not taught.

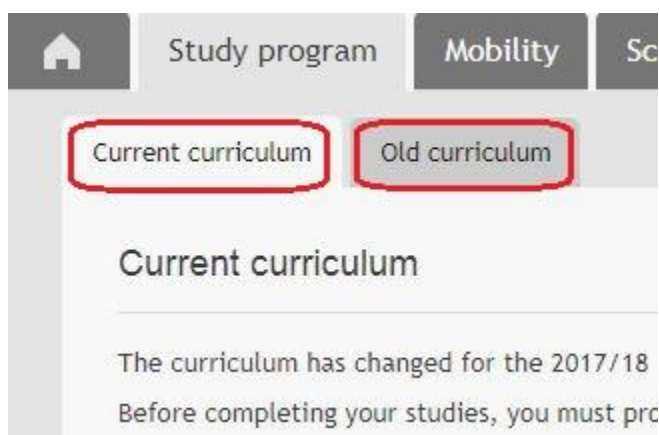

The subject Principles of Economics introduces the student into the rudiments of economic analysis so she (he) can start to thinking as an economist. To achieve this, a complete overview of the economic system is given. It is explained how individual agents relate to each other (consumers and producers) and how their interactions in the market give rise to economic aggregates at the macro level (production of goods and services, price levels, distribution of income). Emphasis is placed on consumer choice (demand) and producer supply in an institutional framework (laws and governments) conditioning their decisions and facilitating exchange relations.

**Skills**

- Identify, organize and analyze relevant economic information in a critic and systematic way.
- Clearly state economic problems assessing their scope and advancing viable solutions.
- Understand the relationship between economy and society in a world strongly influenced by technological progress and climate change.

**Attitudes**

- Respect for economic facts as a basis for decision making both in private and public policies.
- Interest in other persons' ideas and willingness to express own opinions with grounds on empirical references.

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In this case, a student who has not passed the classes for elementary calculus, linear equations, etc. are recommended not to enroll in this class.

You can find the code number of every subject right beside its name. In our example, it is 204-13151 for "Principles of Economics". The codes are usually 8 digits long. The first 3 digits refer to the degree and the posterior 5 refer to the specific subject.
