ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Fall: Early September - Mid-December Winter: Early January - Late April

A reading week is scheduled every mid-semester. Exams are normally held in December and late April. See the exam dates listed in the detailed <u>academic calendar</u>.

Recommended arrival date:

One week before the beginning of the semester (Welcome Week). Late arrivals are not permitted. The arrival deadline is 3 business days before beginning of the semester.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

French with several classes given in English at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

COURSE SELECTION

For the complete courses offering and the most recently updated list for the upcoming semester, please refer to the following section: Courses

Course selection is carried out in May for the fall semester and in November for the winter semester. An email is sent to each student with instructions. Approval by the home university academic advisor is required. We ask all students to select 7 courses. Among these, 4 or 5 (depending on the number of credits required by the home university) will be accepted. We ask students to choose 7 courses to provide alternative options should primary selections be unavailable due to course cancellations, schedule changes or conflicts, etc.

PREREQUISITES

Incoming students are expected to have either completed the stated prerequisite coursework or possess the equivalent knowledge prior to enrolling in a course at FSA ULaval. FSA ULaval is one of the most technologically advanced business schools in Canada. It is highly recommended that all international students bring their laptops with them. Université Laval is a FREE wireless environment.

FULL-TIME WORKLOAD

Every class is worth 3 North American credits. They include 45 hours of teaching per semester and 90 hours of personal work outside of class. To be considered a full-time student, student must be registered for at least 12 credits per semester, which is usually the equivalent of four courses.

Undergraduate and Graduate: 12 to 15 credits (minimum and maximum, including language courses)

Please be advised that graduate students enrolling in 5 courses (15 credits) may face a heavier workload than expected

Teaching methods: Lectures, discussions, presentations, team projects.

Grading scale: Please see above.

COURSES (CONTINUED)

FRENCH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE COURSES

Students can take <u>regular French language courses</u> in addition to their business courses. French language courses (FLE) are offered by the School of languages and are free of charge for exchange students, but an additional fee of \$92 (non refundable after the first week of courses) per 3 credits will be charged to students. FLE courses are included in the total number of credits allowed per semester as part of the exchange. An online test will be given before the beginning of the semester, if the student has not been tested previously.

<u>Intensive French courses</u> are also offered during the summer for students coming at the fall semester or a full year.

OTHER COURSES OUTSIDE THE BUSINESS SCHOOL

Available upon request. A maximum of two courses can be taken outside FSA ULaval. Those courses are mostly given in French, except for the English studies program, where students can take cultural courses.

<u>Language courses</u> in addition to business courses are available with our School of Languages.

Courses in English in the Literature department for undergraduate students.

LANGUAGE AND GRADE REQUIREMENTS

In order to register for business courses in French, student must be able to provide proof of proficiency in French. We accept TFI 860 , DELF and TCF C1 or any other official language test (no letters from teachers or program directors are accepted) showing the student has acquired sufficient knowledge and skills to allow him or her to attend courses taught in French. This document has to be provided at the time of application or course selection. English language proficiency level and grade requirements are determined according to our partner institutions' minimum requirements.

The home institution is responsible for insuring the fluency in English of the students. Students without the adequate level of English run the risk of failing the courses.

Other Language courses offered at the language school include Arabic, Chinese, Italian, Japanese, Spanish, etc.). A test will be administered upon arrival.

TRANSCRIPTS

At the end of each semester, all students receive a free transcript sent to the address indicated in their record. In compliance with the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act of Canada, the Registrar's Office only sends transcripts to students and not to institutions. Students can therefore provide their home university with their own transcripts or they can ask to have another statement issued, which will be sent directly to their coordinator (A \$10 fee will be charged). Students who leave without providing a valid forwarding address are required to order a new copy and also pay a \$10 fee.

WELCOME WEEK, BUDDY PROGRAM

It is highly recommended that incoming exchange students participate in the Welcome Week activities, which take place during the last week of August and in early January.

Globe FSA is a student association for international students. Their objective is to ensure that international students have a great stay, get the correct information and experience a smooth integration at FSA ULaval. Throughout the semester, various activities are planned for international students and their "buddies". You can find them on Facebook.

Indeed, a «Buddy System" has been implemented where each exchange student is assigned a «buddy» from a group of local students. Buddies are Québec students, the majority of whom have themselves been exchange students. They are available to pick students up at the airport or bus/train station, help with registration and provide advice and assistance on other practical matters.



HOUSING AND ACCOMODATIONS

STUDENTS RESIDENCES

Fall semester: A certain number of rooms are prereserved each semester for exchange program students. The number is variable and limited. After June 1st, the rooms unbooked within the prereserved lot will be liberated and offered to anyone on a first come first serve basis. Therefore, it is important to send your reservation form (enclosed with the admission letter) as soon as possible.

Winter semester: First-come, first-serve basis

LIVING/PROSPECTIVE COSTS (IN CANADIAN CURRENCY - CADS)

\$5,000-\$7,000/semester

Food: \$250-\$300/month

Housing: around \$350/month (in residence)

Off-campus housing: around \$300 to \$600/month depending on location and whether sharing cost with others.

Insurance: around \$350/semester (mandatory for international students)

Leisure and other expenses: \$400/month

HEALTH INSURANCE

Depending on the country of origin, students are required to purchase Université Laval insurance: around \$350 /semester.
