
#### Wildlife





## Your program Options

#### Three or four course options

Typically, a full-time course load is 18 units per study period (semester) or 36 units per academic year. However, you can also choose our three course option (13.5 units). That means you'll have more money to travel, have fun and enjoy the Australian lifestyle.

#### **English pathways**

If English is not your first language and you don't meet our English language entry requirement you can apply for a package offer and study at the Centre for English Language at the University of South Australia (CELUSA). Since the English programs are taught at our City


You will receive a certificate upon completion of your study abroad experience. Something to show the folks back home and future employers.

#### When to apply

If you are an exchange student, you will need to check with your home university to find out when you need to apply.

If you are a Study Abroad student, aim to apply at least two months before you want to commence your studies.





## How to Apply



#### Obtain approval from your home institution to spend a semester abroad

If you are an exchange student vou must first be nominated by your home University.

If you are a Study Abroad student you can apply online anytime (aim for two months before you wish to start your study). You can also get help from a UniSA representative in your home country.

#### Check vou meet entry requirements

You must:

- // Be a high school graduate or enrolled in a university or college
- // Be in good academic standing
- // If English is not your first language you may require an objective language test or endorsement from your home institution



#### Choose your courses

#### Accept your offer & apply for a visa

Log into our International Application System to accept your offer. Once you have accepted, we will email your COE within two business days. To apply for your student visa, contact the Department of Home Affairs (HA) or the Australian Embassy in your home country.
