### Camping

The Flinders Ranges is one of the best places to go camping and experience the Australian outback. And if you want somewhere closer to home, Kuitpo Forest offers a nature escape with camping grounds and walking trails.

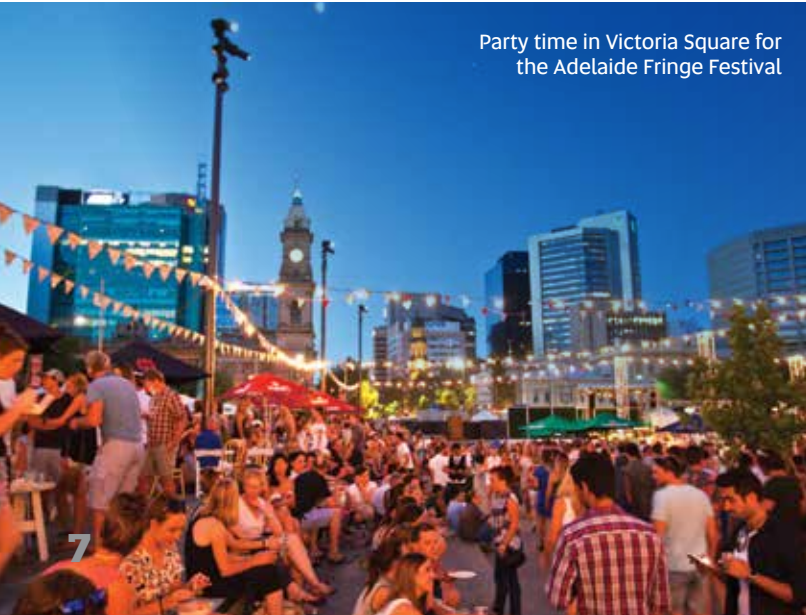

# Options

Three or four course options

Typically, a full-time course load is 18 units per study period (semester) or 36 units per academic year. However, you can also choose our three course option (13.5 units). That means you'll have more money to travel, have fun and enjoy the Australian lifestyle.

English pathways

If English is not your first language and you don't meet our English language entry requirement you can apply for a package offer and study at the Centre for English Language at the University of South Australia (CELUSA). Since the English programs are taught at our City West campus you'll already feel like you're part of the University along with access to our facilities and academic and personal support services.

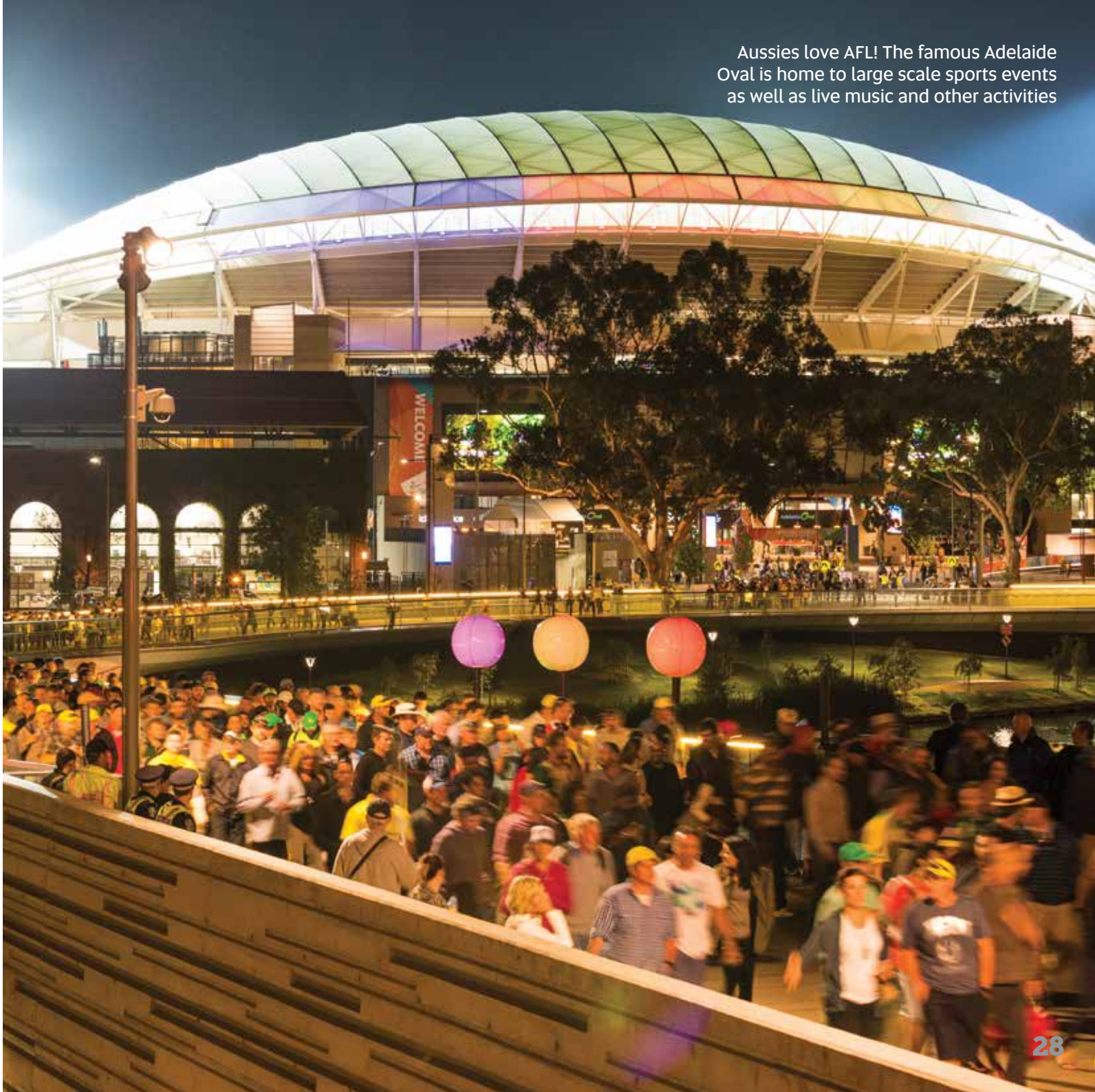

# How to Apply

# 1

## Obtain approval from your home institution to spend a semester abroad

If you are an exchange student you must first be nominated by your home University.

If you are a Study Abroad student you can apply online anytime (aim for two months before you wish to start your study). You can also get help from a UniSA representative in your home country.

## Check you meet entry requirements

You must:

- // Be a high school graduate or enrolled in a university or college
- // Be in good academic standing
- // If English is not your first language you may require an objective language test or endorsement from your home institution

## Submit your online application

Log into our International Application System to accept your offer. Once you have accepted, we will email your COE within two business days. To apply for your student visa, contact the Department of Home Affairs (HA) or the Australian Embassy in your home country.
