Who is Johannes Kepler?

Astronomer and mathematician Johannes Kepler was an educator in Linz between 1612 and 1626. He discovered that the Earth and planets orbit around the sun elliptically and wrote the three fundamental laws of planetary motion.

Academic Calendar

The academic calendar is divided into two semesters. Winter Semester dates are October 1 to January 31 and Summer Semester is from March 1 to June 30; plan to arrive at least two weeks before the start of the semester to attend orientation and a pre-semester intensive German language course.

Travelling to Linz

There are many convenient airline connections to Linz, either by direct flight or via Frankfurt, Munich or Vienna. The airports in Vienna, Salzburg or Munich are only a short train ride from Linz, however don't forget that you will be travelling with a heavy luggage which you must carry yourself.
